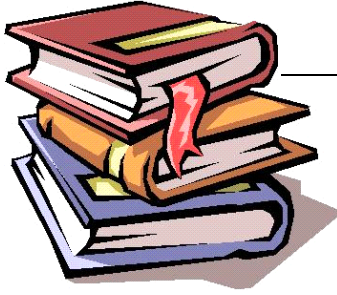
The [2010 Big Event](#) variety show is scheduled for Friday, April 16.

This year we are excited that Steve & Lindee Yannello along with 3 of their children, Havanah, Scott, & Sidnee help in GNC each week.

Here is a testimony from Lindee,

"When Mrs. Hubbard told us that they entered into a public school to tell children about Jesus, my heart leaped! I had researched the C.E.F. online and I knew that this was something my family needed to be a part of because it trains young adults to lead children to Christ. I felt that this would help them to get comfortable with leading people of any age to Christ.

Our first day at the Good News Club was particularly scary to me because I hadn't been in this environment since I was that age, but as I kept looking over at each of my children during the first meeting, they seemed to be handling this new environment better than I was. And when we left, we continued to talk about these kids for days. It has meant a lot for me to have my children be able to do what Jesus has asked each of us to do when he left us: to "go into all the world and spread the good news".

The Good News Club has not only been a very spiritually fulfilling experience for myself and my children, but also is has opened up new topics of conversation and prayer at home where I can continue to instill in my own children the need and the passion for this kind of ministry."

Christmas Shoeboxes for Baja

A big thanks to all who participated in this year's Shoebox Project for the Baja Ministries-Bible College, Boys Ranch, churches in Rosarito and Ensenada, and to the missionary families, the Kisers. We filled 71 boxes, provided them with bags and bags of stuffed animals, and 60 handmade lap blankets that will be used during the cold winter months in the churches (they have no heating!). In addition, thanks to the several men who donated used suits, dress pants, shirts, etc. for the pastors and Bible College students.

We, the Christopher family delivered the boxes to Rosarito the weekend of December 19-20. We had a tremendous time visiting with the children at the Boys Ranch-"Casa de Hogar". The Ranch is laid out with age segregated dorms for the boys.

There are shower rooms, bathrooms, a large laundry room, and a huge clothes closet for all the boys. The dining hall also serves as a gathering place for playing games, watching videos, visiting, or as a study hall. The grounds are lovely with growing fruit trees, playground equipment, and most impressively and noticeably the gigantic gymnasium that is under construction. It is to be completed in the new year. We stayed on the campus in the two-bedroom guest apartment. The boys and the staff were so friendly that our family felt a part of them!
